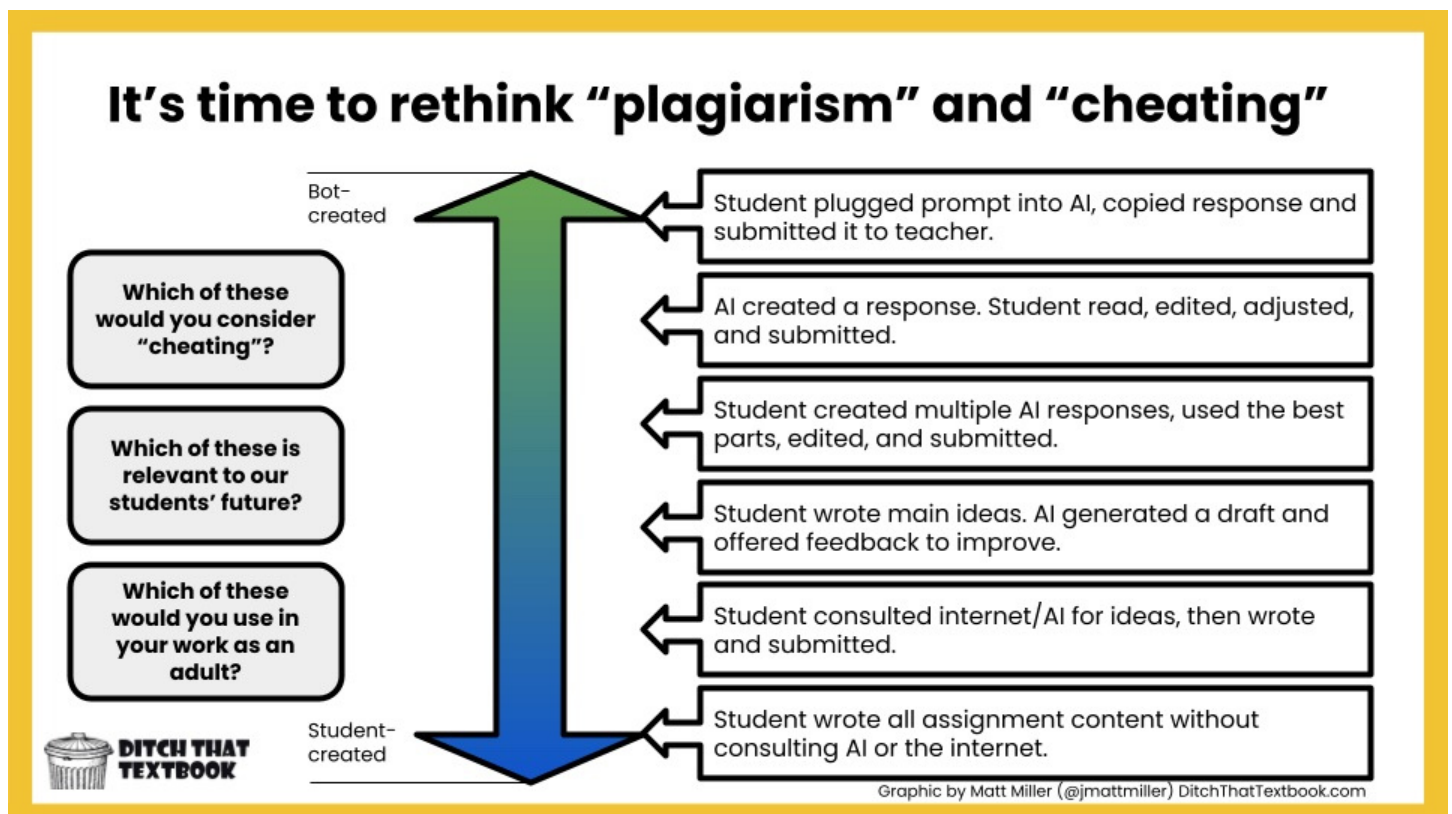

**1) Start with Perspective:** Review this image from [@Matt Miller @DitchThatTextbook](https://twitter.com/jmattmiller) to help guide your thinking about cheating and generative AI (GenAI).



**2) Understand Detection Limits:** Note that there is no “fool-proof” way to detect AI in student work. The risk of *false positives* and impact on *students' emotional wellbeing* from accusations of cheating are profound and require educators to approach suspected AI use with careful consideration, clear evidence, and open dialogue.

**3) Move Forward:** Rather than relying on detection tools, we can create clear AI policies, teach AI literacy, and *design assignments* that meaningfully target critical thinking skills and blend AI and human skills.

**4) Strategy for Assignments - “Proof of Process”** -students show their work through drafts, reflections, and future iterations with the release of new information.
