Only digital media is used



Voiceover, digital images, video, animations



Gives everyday people a voice to tell their stories

Why Digital Storytelling?



Video proven to increase engagement and learning retention while encouraging discussion



Give lessons longevity and consistency



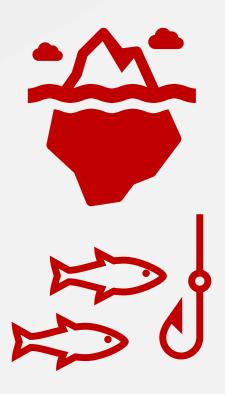
Inspires creativity



Fosters communication and collaboration skills



- Point of View
 - Personal perspective
 - Characterizing a perspective
- Dramatic Question
 - Audience attention getter
 - "The Hook"





- Emotional Content
 - Want an emotional response from the audience
 - Demonstrates the effectiveness of your story
- Economy
 - Be concise with your voiceover
 - Prioritize different segments
 - Helps maintain audience attention
 - Descriptive images





- Pacing
 - Determining the rhythm of the story
 - · Bad pacing can disengage the audience
- The Gift of Voice
 - Use your voice to EFFECTIVELY tell your story
 - Pitch, inflection, enunciation





- Soundtrack
 - Music can enhance your story
 - Effective in creating an emotional response





3 Phases of Digital Storytelling:



Phases of Digital Storytelling: Pre-Production

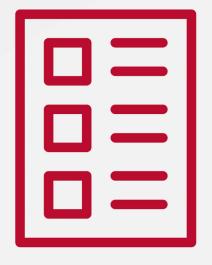
- Scriptwriting
 - 1 page of script = 1 minute of story
 - Easy to read out loud
 - Structure: Beginning, Middle AND End





Phases of Digital Storytelling: Pre-Production

- Storyboard
 - Imagine the types of images you would like to use
 - Helps to generate/remember ideas
 - Less time spent making decisions later





Phases of Digital Storytelling: Production

- Produce
 - Capture Video
 - Compile Images
 - Record Voiceover
 - Select Soundtrack (optional)

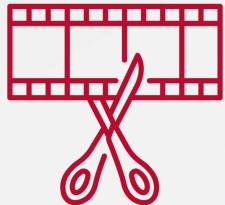




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Phases of Digital Storytelling: Post-Production

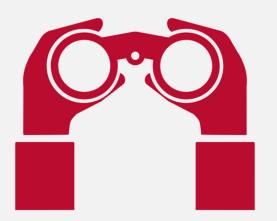
- Time to Edit
 - Editing Software
 - Mac users: iMovie
 - Windows users: Clipchamp
 - Internet full of Tutorials
 - Search: "software name", version or year, keywords
 - E.g. iMovie 10.4.2, basics, (for beginners, introduction)



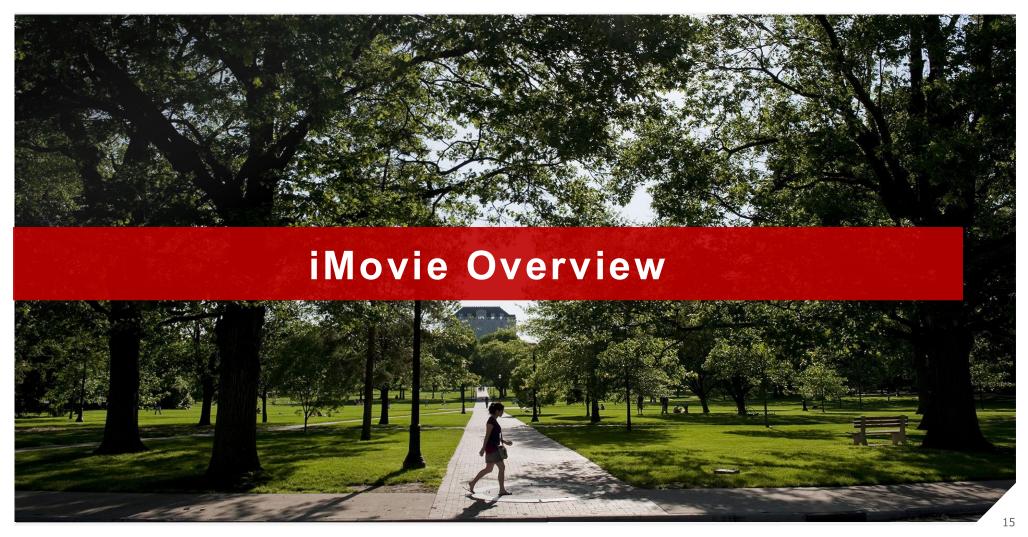


Activity
